## Guideline

1. 본 교재의 진도와 병행해서 꾸준히 해야 해. 제발!! 하루에 $3 \sim 4$ 문제 밖에 안 돼.
2. 빈칸도 직접 다 뚫었고, 혼자서 mp3 파일 한 문장, 한 문장 다 분할하는 작업을 했어. 너희들이 최대한 효율적으로 학습할 수 있도록 만들었어.
